CORPUS CHRISTI FEAST DAY



On the Sunday after Trinity Sunday, the Church celebrates The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. This Feast commemorates the immense gift of the Eucharist in our lives and in the Church. In Latin, Corpus Christi means Body of Christ. On Holy Thursday, we remember the institution of the priesthood and the Eucharist, the Last Supper, the Agony in the Garden, the betrayal of Judas and the beginning of the Passion of Christ. Message from the Principal

You may have heard that primary teachers have accepted the new terms of their Collective Agreement with the MOE which means there will be no further strike action this year - this is great news for our community! Our Secondary colleagues are still in negotiations with rolling strikes planned for the remainder of this term. As a mother of 3 high school students in Years 11-13, I know first-hand how this strike action is impacting learning and I can only pray that issues will soon be resolved, especially following a period of time compounded by the complexities of COVID.

St Mark's school is humming and our learners are certainly enjoying this finer weather. Teachers are in the process of completing mid-year reports. Assessment data and observations of learning progress and achievement has created a real buzz amongst our staff and children with the fruits of their hard labour paying dividends.
