# **PLANNING FOR 2024**

#### **ENROLLING NOW**

We are accepting enrolments for children turning 5 in the next 18 months. If you have a 3 or 4 year old at home, please collect a pack from the office. Also, if you have family arriving from overseas with school aged children who require primary schooling in NZ, please arrange a time to meet with Tracey Kopua. Enrolment forms are also available at the office or through the school website.

If St Mark's is not in your family's plans for next year (moving house, going overseas etc.) please advise the school asap as this assists our planning. There is no need for families of our Year 6 school leavers to do so.

# **HEALTH, NUTRITION and WELLBEING**

#### Covid and Cold/Flu bugs

You will be aware that the Government announced the removal of the mandatory COVID isolation rule, which took effect on 15 August 2023. This does not mean that Covid has disappeared and we would still encourage you to be vigilant and test if symptomatic. Over the past week or so we have experienced a wave of sickness/illness across our school. This particular nasty virus seems to be lasting anywhere between 1 and 2 weeks. If your child displays any cold/flu symptoms they should stay home and only return to school when well. If your child is coughing, sneezing and feeling generally unwell during the school day you will be called to pick up your child. As you can appreciate, colds and flus, like Covid, are highly contagious and we would like to keep as many of our students and staff well.

#### **Vomiting - school policy**

If your child has a tummy bug causing vomiting or diarrhea, there is a 48 stand down from school period.

#### **Lunches and morning tea snacks**

We are noticing an increase in the amount of pre-packaged, highly processed, sugary foods being packed in lunch boxes. These snacks, whilst appearing convenient, are very expensive and have little nutritional value. Children need healthier food options to sustain energy during the school day and to support healthy growth. We encourage fruit, veggies, sandwiches, wraps, cooked eggs, chicken, ham, salami etc.

#### **General wellbeing**

We strive to be an inclusive, safe and happy school, however we know that schools are not perfect largely due to the complexity and dynamics of relationships. If for any reason you are concerned about your child's safety or wellbeing at school, please do not hesitate to contact your child's classroom teacher or a member of the school's leadership team.
